GENERAL STATEMENT Principles and Guidelines

Students in WA attending government schools are required to be clean and appropriately dressed for school activities.

After consultation with the P&C, teachers and students, the School Council of Anzac Terrace Primary School has established a dress code for all students attending the school. This Code complies with the policy and guidelines as set down by the Department of Education and Training. This Dress Code includes and supports the wearing of SCHOOL UNIFORMS.

The Dress Code Requirements are:-

- 1) **DRESS MUST BE APPROPRIATE FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES.**
- 2) **DRESS MUST SUPPORT AND PROMOTE HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS.**
- 3) **DRESS MUST NOT DISTRACT OR BE DISRUPTIVE TO THE LEARNING PROGRAMME.**

Parents are asked to ensure their children follow the dress code and are neat, clean and tidy for school activities. If students do not comply, a letter may be sent home or telephone contact made to parents asking that students follow the dress code.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

The School Council has the support of the school community to provide and encourage the wearing of the school uniform.

The School Council believes school uniform -

- fosters and enhances the public image of the school
- assists in building school and team spirit
- ensures students are safely dressed for specific school activities
- encourages equity among students
- can reduce cost to parents compared with fashion and fad clothing - and
- prepares students for work, as many work places have dress and safety codes.

The uniform currently is

Tops Polo shirt – yellow, with school logo

Rugby shirt – Blue, with school logo

Navy blue microfibre jacket

Navy blue fleece jacket

Bottoms Navy blue skort / skirt (with dark sports bloomer

Navy blue microfibre shorts;

Long navy blue microfibre pants; or

Navy blue school tracksuit pants.

Dress The uniform dress material can be purchased from the P&C.

Sport Faction Sports T-shirts are to be worn on designated sports days.

Discovery Red Success Blue Endeavour Green

Uniform (Interschool sport is as above)

Official uniforms can be purchased from the P&C or plain T-shirts of the correct colour may be used.

Denim wear IS NOT part of the school uniform.

Uniforms may be ordered at P&C sales approximately twice a term. Second hand uniforms may be purchased if available by contacting the second hand uniform coordinator.

Students not wearing the school uniform may be denied the opportunity to represent their school at official school activities, which include sporting and social events.

Prefects and all school representatives must adhere to the uniform requirements outlined in this policy.

DRESS MUST BE APPROPRIATE FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES -

- Clothing needs to be neat and comfortable.
- Dress needs to allow students to participate in all activities including sport sessions.
- Leisure wear is not appropriate or acceptable for school.

DRESS MUST SUPPORT AND PROMOTE HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS -

- **Hats are compulsory all year.** Broad brimmed hats or legionnaire hats are compulsory as they offer more protection from the sun on the neck and face.
- Shoes / sneakers or sandals which strap to the foot are required (no thongs).
- Jewellery items are only acceptable if they are safe for all school situations eg wrist watches and sleepers or studs.

Necklaces, wrist bands, earrings are not acceptable.

- Shoulder length hair must be tied back.

DRESS MUST NOT DISTRACT OR BE DISRUPTIVE TO THE LEARNING PROGRAMME -

- Plain clothes (with no slogans) are suitable if uniform not available.
- Make-up and or nail polish is not acceptable at any time.
