I am pleased to provide you with the following details regarding our 2024 Year 6 Camp.

Excursion to:	Ern Halliday Recreation Camp
Class/Year groups attending:	Year 6 students
Departure venue, date and time:	Monday 11 th March 9:30am from ATPS. Students will need to meet in the Undercover Area at 8:30am.
Return venue, date and time:	Wednesday 13 th March 1:45pm from Ern Halliday. Students will need to be collected from the Undercover Area by parents/guardians.

Travel details:	<p>Bus Travel – Pauls Bus</p> <p>Students will depart Anzac Terrace Primary School at 9.00am, Monday 11th March. The bus will take students straight to Ern Halliday Recreation Camp, arriving in time for morning tea. Students will be organised into dormitories prior to commencing their first activity at 11.00am.</p> <p>Students will return to school on Wednesday 13th March, at approximately 2.45pm. We will be leaving Ern Halliday Recreation Camp after eating lunch.</p>
Accommodation venue: (Attach any billet information)	<p>Ern Halliday Recreation Camp - Students will be divided into boys and girls and will be staying in dormitories in bunk beds. Students are asked to supply a pillowcase and either a sleeping bag or blanket/sheets. A sleeping bag would be the easiest option. Each dorm has two large rooms with bunk beds, five toilets, five showers and facilities for four staff members in each.</p> <p>Students will be responsible for the care and maintenance of their respective dormitories. All dormitories will be inspected daily by one of the teaching staff. Students will also be involved in camp duties. This will either be in the dining hall as a setter and server or in the dormitory as a cleaner. A roster will be set closer to camp.</p> <p>Accolade Catering will provide breakfast, lunch and dinner. If any student has any special health or food requirements, they can be catered for properly. Please advise Miss Irvine <u>ASAP</u> of these requirements via the attached consent form. All students will be encouraged to take a serving of what is being offered as the children voted on their food preferences and the most popular choices were chosen. We also ask that no student bring food to the camp as all food will be provided. Lollies and any other form of junk food are not permitted</p>

	<p>We will be sharing the camp site with another primary school during our stay, however we do not interact with the other school during our stay.</p> <p>The camp school has a number of sporting facilities that the students are able to use during down time. We will be taking equipment for the students to use. We ask that they do not bring their own.</p> <p>A set of <i>Camp Rules</i> will be placed in each student's <i>Camp Booklet</i>. Copies of these rules will also be displayed in the dormitories. Each student will be under full supervision 24 hours a day while on camp. Every safety precaution will be strictly adhered to. This should ensure a safe, fulfilling and enjoyable camp for both the students and supervisors.</p>

The final cost per student will be \$260. This money covers all aspects of the camp including transport, accommodation, catering and the various activities. Payments can be made in installments, however, all camp charges MUST be paid prior to your child attending. There will be no exceptions. Payment needs to be finalised by Friday 1st March. Special clothing or other items required

All excursion participants are to comply with all venue/site special clothing or other item requirements as prescribed.

Details: For the journey to Ern Halliday Recreation Camp, all students are asked to wear neat, casual clothing and comfortable footwear. Parents are asked to keep in mind the location and nature of the activities when choosing suitable clothes. Students will be involved in both water based activities and outdoor educational activities. Clothing for both types of activities will be required. The nights may be cold. Please make sure you pack sufficient warm clothes for your child.

Parents are asked to please ensure that all their child's clothing and bedding is **clearly labelled** and packed, if possible, in one soft-styled bag. This will make packing all the luggage on the coach much simpler and quicker to unload. Please make sure your child's bag is clearly labelled or easily identified.

While on camp, all bedding and clothing is the sole responsibility of its owner. All camp lost property will remain at school for a period of one week before being disposed of.

Clothing List

- 5 sets of clothes – this will include clothes to wear during the day for activities and to change into after their shower each night. Please include warm clothes for the cooler weather at night.
- Set of underwear for each day and 1 spare in case of “accidents”
- A pair of socks for each day
- Bathers
- Pyjamas
- Shoes - closed in shoes for outdoor education type activities. Thongs may be worn for water based activities.

Camp Accessories

- Toilet bag: containing flannel, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, hairbrush, comb, and 50+ Sunscreen.
- 2 towels – one for showering and the other for water based activities.
- Pillow case, sleeping bag or sheets.
- School pencil case
- Camp Booklet – provided by school.
- Medication – if required, eg. Asthma inhaler, Epi Pen, motion sickness, etc. All medication needs to be clearly labelled and given to Miss Irvine prior to departure. Clearly written instructions about correct administration and dosage need to be provided. (forms will be uploaded to Connect to fill out on 6th November)
- A current repeat script for relevant medication (if required) in case of damage or loss while on camp.
- Plastic bag – shopping or garbage bag for dirty clothing.
- Books or comics.
- Hat/beanie
- Insect repellent
- Torch and spare batteries if required and clearly labelled.

Please make sure all of your child’s items are clearly labelled.

Electronic devices and other valuables

No student electronic devices or spending money will be permitted on camp. Any personal items brought on camp will be the responsibility of the student.
